MEET OUR NEW ISOO BOARD MEMBERS



Deborah (Debbie) Saunders, DDS, graduated from the University of Manitoba, Faculty of Dentistry in 1999 and resumes a full-time practice as Medical Director of the Department of Dental Oncology, Program Lead for Clinical Tobacco Intervention and the Oral Maxillofacial Rehabilitation Program at the Health Sciences North, Northeast Regional Cancer Centre. She is also Assistant Professor at the Northern Ontario School of Medicine. Debbie is the incoming President and Chair of ISOO's Oral Care Study Group. Her areas of research include MRONJ, ORN, oral mucositis, clinical tobacco intervention, and genetic phenotyping in the oncology setting. She is an avid promoter of patient education and knowledge translation between research and clinical care.



Siri Beier Jensen, DDS, PhD, is Associate Professor of Oral Medicine and Head of the Department of Dentistry and Oral Health, Faculty of Health, Aarhus University, Denmark. Siri graduated from the University of Copenhagen School of Dentistry in 1998. Her research interests include salivary gland dysfunction and oral complications of cancer therapies. She teaches oral medicine, oral physiology, and anatomy, and practices oral medicine in a university clinic. She serves on the Steering Committee of the World Workshop on Oral Medicine.



Barbara Murphy, MD, is a medical oncologist who specializes in head and neck cancer, as well as in pain and symptom management. She has served as the team leader for the Head and Neck Research Team and the Director of the Pain and Symptom Management Program at the Vanderbilt Ingram Cancer Center. Barbara has extensive experience in the development, implementation, and management of clinical trials, supportive care studies, and grants. She has amassed a significant body of work reflecting both investigator-initiated trials and cooperative group studies. She has participated in numerous national and international organizations, grant review committees, and conferences. Barbara has also served as a mentor for numerous trainees, including doctoral students, post-doctoral students, fellows, and junior faculty. Currently, she serves as the Chair of the Junior Faculty Mentoring Oversight Committee.



Eduardo Fregnani, DDS, MS, PhD, received both his DDS and a Masters degree in Oral Pathology and Medicine from the University of Campinas, Brazil, and a PhD in Medical Sciences from AC Camargo Cancer Center, Brazil. Since 2011, he has worked at the Sírio-Libanês Hospital in São Paulo where he coordinates the Oral Medicine Service and conducts research in oncology, pathology, and dentistry.



John Wu, MD, FRCPC, is a radiation oncologist at the Vancouver Cancer Centre. He completed his training at the Cross Cancer Institute and the University of Washington Medical Center. He is a Clinical Associate Professor at the University of British Columbia and is the Chair of the Provincial H&N Tumour Group. His interests include the development of precision radiation therapy techniques, leveraging health information technologies to improve access to health information, and population-based quality assurance and outcomes research.



Caroline Speksnijder, PT, MSc, MMPT, PhD, obtained her degree in Physical Therapy at Rotterdam University, her MSc degree of Human Movement Sciences as well as Epidemiology at Maastricht University in 2002, and her MMPT degree of Orofacial Physical Therapy in 2008. Her 2011 PhD research at the University of Utrecht was titled "Function after Oral Oncological Intervention, Reconstruction and Rehabilitation." She works as a senior researcher at UMC Utrecht and Radboudumc Nijmegen. Caroline's research focuses on head and neck cancer, function of the head and neck, and physical therapy, and she has developed an augmented reality training method to study orofacial motor control..
