Adelaide, Australia was the host city for the 2016 MASCC/ISOO meeting, held June 23-25, 2016 – the first time the meeting has been held outside of North America or Europe. The meeting was a huge success, attracting 1,070 registrants from over 50 countries. A pre-meeting half-day session for cancer patients was held on June 22nd and was extremely well-received. Workshops and parallel sessions were well-attended. A special thanks to the local organizing committee for all their efforts.

ISOO continues to grow and now has members from 42 countries. It was particularly satisfying to see ISOO members from Southeast Asia in attendance at the Adelaide meeting.

Plans are already in place for the 2017 meeting to be held June 22-24, 2017 in Washington, DC. Hope to see you all there!

Dr. Raj Lalla was elected as MASCC President-Elect at the 2016 MASCC/ISOO meeting in Adelaide, Australia. Dr. Lalla will assume the MASCC Presidency in 2018. This will represent the first time an ISOO member will serve as MASCC President. Congratulations!



#### Oral Care Study Group (OCSG) 2016 Progress Report

Submitted by OCSG Chair (Debbie Saunders) and Co-Chair (Siri Beier Jensen)

- The multi-center, clinical, prospective study assessing oral complications in adult hematopoietic stem cell transplant patients (OraStem) and pediatric hematopoietic stem cell transplant patients (PedOraStem) led by Inger von Bültzingslöwen and Mike Brennan is progressing well. For the adult OraStem study, seven centers have enrolled patients. A preliminary report on the first 81 patients was presented in Adelaide. The goal is to enroll 238 patients. For the pediatric OraStem study, four centers have enrolled patients or are in planning phase. Site visits have been carried out at three of the four centers and the fourth is planned to take place soon.
- A joint project of the OCSG (headed by Sharon Elad) and the European Society for Blood and Marrow Transplantation (EBMT) Group (represented by Barry Quinn and Arno Mark) has developed guidelines to medical/clinical staff in providing oral care for patients treated with stem cell transplantation. This collaboration has resulted in a published position paper to be launched by representatives from each of our organisations.
- ISOO president Richard Logan gave an invited talk on the position paper at the EBMT annual meeting 2015 in Istanbul, Turkey.
- A paper was published on the clinical approach in the management of oral chronic graft-versus host disease by Sharon Elad.
- A project on clinical standards of care in the diagnosis, prevention and treatment of chemoradiotherapy-induced dysphagia in H&N cancer patients, based on an electronic survey from the Dysphagia Section of the OCSG, is in the final phase of manuscript publication. This project has been headed by Paolo Bossi, Barbara Murphy and Elvio Russi.
- The systematic review updates and outcome measures project is well under way. Three sections
  have finished reviewing papers and the data is currently under statistical preparation. The other
  seven sections are completing their reviews.
- The OCSG chairing group has worked with ASCO representatives on joint endorsement of the clinical management guidelines. A memorandum of understanding has been signed between ASCO and MASCC/ISOO.

- An ONJ guideline committee has been developed and dissemination of joint guidelines on ONJ is expected this summer.
- The OCSG and ISOO have endorsed 4 patient care fact sheets developed at the Northeast Cancer Centre in Sudbury, Canada. These fact sheets outline Oral care in Chemotherapy, Pre-XRT, During XRT and Post-XRT. These fact sheets have been validated and translated into 21 languages. These will serve as a valuable ISOO member benefit. Production into downloadable videos on oral care is in progress and the first of these videos was shown at the Adelaide meeting.
- A call will go out in the Fall 2016 for a new OCSG Chair and Co-Chair as the terms of our incumbents (Debbie Saunders and Siri Beier Jensen) are coming to an end in 2017. Interested persons should submit applications.
- Planning is underway for the OCSG parallel session at the Washington DC meeting in 2017
- OCSG continues to thrive based on its collaborations with many international groups including ASCO, NCI, CAHD, ICD, IAOO and
  others. In addition, collaborative research has been initiated within the OCSG itself such as the prospective trial currently
  underway evaluating the benefits of HBO in post-radiotherapy dental extractions.

## Systematic Review and Patient Fact Sheet Update - 2016

As many of you are likely aware, the Oral Care Study Group has completed and published systematic reviews of the most common oral side effects of cancer therapy. The challenge now is to keep the reviews current. In this light, we are looking to review the most recent literature to see if any changes need to be incorporated into our guidelines. Currently the groups actively looking for reviewers includes: Xerostomia, Trismus, Dysphagia and Pediatrics. The other groups will be looking for reviewers as they go to update in the future.

In addition, the Oral Care Study Group is proud to announce that the *Patient Fact Sheets on Oral Care Pre-Radiotherapy, During Radiotherapy, Post-Radiotherapy as well as During Chemotherapy* will be posted on the ISOO portal and ready for download by September 2016. In addition, we will be looking to develop Patient Fact Sheets on (i) Oral care Post Stem Cell Transplant (ii) Late Effects of Head & Neck Radiotherapy and (iii) Palliative Oral Care. #### How can you get involved?


As a MSG member you have the unique opportunity to contribute in multiple ways:

Please note that these sections are subject to change during the initial stages of the review while we are assessing the results of the complete literature search. We will do our best to accommodate members in their requested study sections. Unfortunately, we cannot guarantee that all requests will be met.



We invite your suggestions for keywords. We will be enlisting the support of a medical librarian during this phase of the review. The list of keywords that were used in the previous mucositis guidelines update as well as new keywords will be used to organize the new literature search.

#### ecancer project on Osteonecrosis of the Jaw and Bone-Targeting Agents



ecancer, <a href="www.ecancer.org">www.ecancer.org</a>, is a global cancer education charity dedicated to providing equitable access to oncology research and is the leading non-profit educational platform for oncology professionals. ecancer publishes the non-profit, open-access, peer-reviewed Journal of the European Institute of Oncology (IEO) and the Organization of European Cancer Institutes (OECI). It currently hosts over 4000 videos and over 150 hours of e-learning modules.

#### The ONJ Project

The study will measure current levels of understanding amongst oncology professionals of the risks of developing osteonecrosis of the jaw for patients with bone metastases, when prescribed with

bone targeting agents (BTAs), denosumab (XGEVA®), zoledronate (Zometa®), or pamidronate (Aredia®) or generics.

We invite ISOO members from all European Countries to participate in this important Europe wide survey. Results from the study will be used to assess the effectiveness of e-learning educational programs in managing osteonecrosis of the jaw and will inform future pharmacovigilance needs in the European setting.

The survey is relevant for all European oncology professionals who (1) currently practice as an oncology specialist in the EU, Norway or Switzerland, (2) have treated more than 5 new or continuing adult patients with bone metastases from solid tumours in the last 3 months, and (3) have prescribed a bone targeting agent (BTAs) in the last 12 months,

The survey is online at <a href="http://Bit.ly/ONJsurvey">http://Bit.ly/ONJsurvey</a> and will only take you about four minutes to complete. Results will be fully anonymized and will be used to help create an open access elearning module to improve management of this condition.

Everyone who takes part will be sent a copy of this important new resource. The module will be fully accredited and completing it counts towards your continued professional development. It will also be a superb teaching tool.
