I am one of you who cares about cancer and cancer patients. My name is Kıvanç Bektaş-Kayhan from İstanbul, Turkey. After graduating from İstanbul University Faculty of Dentistry in 2000 (of note, the first dental faculty of Turkey, founded in 1908), I started my PhD in Oral Medicine and Surgery. In these years I was dealing with head and neck and as well as pediatric cancer patients. My thesis focused on oral cancer.

The problem was about reading literature... so much data and hard to decide between treatment alternatives. I was in need of talking to colleagues since there was so much out there in the literature. 2006 was a turning point. At the 8th Congress of European Association of Oral Medicine, I met many distinguished colleagues including Professor Ourania Nicolatou-Galitis. She led the way and I followed. I was with MASCC/ISOO

soon and it was like being in the best friend's party. I joined the working groups and learned so much.

What we all believed was the possibility of a better life even with cancer. This had many different meaning depending on discipline but, as dentists, oral care was the core theme.

I just want to know that it's a big pleasure to work with ISOO group in any position and welcome the opportunity to serve as the Chair of the Oral Care Study Group.
