### Let's Meet Our New Board



#### Noam Yarom - President

Noam Yarom, DMD, MHA, is the head of Oral Medicine at the Sheba Medical Center, Tel Hashomer and a clinical associate professor of Oral Medicine at Tel-Aviv University, Tel-Aviv, Israel. Dr. Yarom is a past president of the Israeli Society of Oral Medicine (ISOM) and a past board member of the European Association of Oral Medicine (EAOM). He is involved withdeveloping clinical practice guidelines and position papers for major international organizations such as the American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO), the Multinational Association of Supportive Care in Cancer (MASCC) and the International Society of Oral Oncology (ISOO). He is also an active member of the European Organization of Research and Treatment of Cancer (EORTC) quality of life group, where he is involved in developing quality of life questionnaires for cancer patients.

His main research interests are oral complications of cancer therapy and quality of life in cancer patients, and he has published extensively on these topics.



### Alessandro Villa - President Elect

Alessandro Villa, DDS, PhD, MPH, is chief of oral medicine, oral oncology and dentistry at Miami Cancer Institute where he also serves as the Program Director of the Oral Oncology Fellowship. In addition, he is a Professor at the Herbert Wertheim College of Medicine, FIU. Dr. Villa specializes in treating oral mucosal and salivary gland diseases, oral precancers and oral complications from cancer treatment. Prior to joiningMiami Cancer Institute in 2022, Dr. Villa was an attending physician at the University of California San Francisco (UCSF). He also directed the oral medicine residency programs at UCSF and Harvard. Dr. Villa's research focuses on oral dysplasia, oral complications from cancer therapy and

prevention of HPV-associated oropharyngeal cancers. He is involved in several investigator initiated and sponsored clinical trials and has published more than 130 peer-reviewed manuscripts.



# Eduardo Fregnani – Immediate Past President

Eduardo Fregnani, DDS, MSc, PhD, assumed the role of President of the International Society of Oral Oncology (ISOO) for the period spanning 2021 to 2023. Additionally, he presently holds positions as a member of the ISOO Board and as the ISOO liaison at the MASCC Board. He obtained a degree in Dentistry from the State University of Campinas in the year 2000. Subsequently, he pursued a Master's degree in Stomatopathology from the same institution in 2003. Later, he finished a PhD in Medical Sciences from the Antônio Prudente Foundation in 2008. He also specializes in the fields of Endodontics and Oral, with a research emphasis on providing assistance to cancer patients and addressing oral issues arising from cancer therapy at IEP-Hospital Sírio Libanês in Sao Paulo, Brasil.



### Derek Smith - Treasurer

Derek Smith, DDS, PhD, MPH, is a general dentist and biostatistician. He currently serves as the Director of Oral Health Services for the State of Tennessee overseeing 46 safety net clinics, the school-based sealant program, work-force development programs, and the oral health surveillance program. Dr. Smith holds an academic appointment at Vanderbilt University Medical Center where his research has focused on the oral health implications of head and neck cancer and side effects of therapy. He has been an ISOO member since 2016 and has served in the leadership of the oral care study group, organized parallel sessions for the annual meeting, and put on a workshop on systematic reviews at the San Fransisco meeting.



#### We are here for you

Lots of activity is happening within ISOO. In the past few months the new ISOO Board has met regularly to prepare the scientific program for the 2024 MASCC/AFSOS/ISOO Annual Meeting. We anticipate to hear back from the Scientific Committee of the annual meeting soon and will continue to update you about the program for our ISOO members as it shapes up.

During the last few months, the ISOO President has worked tediously to build a new collaboration between ISOO and EORTC. The responses received so far from the leads of the Quality of Life department of EORTC are very promising. We hope that this new collaboration will mature into a joint session at the 2024 Lille meeting.

ISOO is positioning itself as a lead party developing joint guidelines on osteoradionecrosis of the jaw. Partners for this guideline paper are the American Society of Clinical Oncology (ASCO) and MASCC. There is great interest by other medical societies in these guidelines. The ISOO members had a window into this process a few weeks ago when the current draft was circulated to membership by email and was given the opportunity to review and comment on the draft. The discussions about the development of the guidelines are in advanced stages. We thank the ISOO leads who participated in this important project – Drs. Paolo Bossi, Barbara Murphy, Doug Peterson, Debbie Saunders, Derek Smith, Alessandro Villa, Erin Watson, Noam Yarom, Jonn Wu and the remaining ISOO Board for their important input into these guideline paper.



### Meet a New ISOO Member



### Ali Shazib

Ali Shazib, BDS, DMD, completed his Bachelor of Dental Surgery from Pakistan (Gold Medalist) and Doctor of Dental Medicine (DMD) from Boston University School of Dental Medicine (Honors). He went on to complete his residency in Oral Medicine at Harvard School of Dental Medicine, where he was elected as Chief Oral Medicine Resident for Dana-Farber Cancer Institute and Brigham and Women's Hospital. Dr. Shazib was a recipient of the prestigious Joseph Henry Award from Harvard School of Dental Medicine, recognized for outstanding contribution in patient care and research. Prior to residency training, Dr. Shazib was a practicing owner of a large multi-specialty dental clinic and founding director for hospital oral medicine services at University of North-Carolina Chapel Hill.

As Chief Clinical Of cer and Assistant Dean for Practice, Dr. Shazib is responsible for developing clinical service lines, medical-dental integration, treatment guidelines (standard of care), compliance and credentialing, electronic health records, clinical faculty affairs, and strategic partnerships with healthcare systems and industry.

Dr. Shazib's clinical interests include dentistry for medically complex patients, oral oncology (oral healthcare for patients before, during, and after cancer therapy), oral medicine (management of oral-systemic conditions), and orofacial pain (TMD, headaches, migraines, neuropathies). He is the Founding Director and maintains clinical practice in Oral Medicine Oncology Services at Novant Health Cancer Institute and Atrium Health- Wake Forest Baptist/ High Point Medical Center.

In the area of research and discovery, Dr. Shazib interests are in cancer-treatment related oral adverse events, emerging therapeutics for mucosal disorders, tissue engineering and regenerative medicine, and precision medicine. He has recently published guidelines on management of patients suffering from immunotherapy related adverse events. He serves as a peer reviewer for Journals such as Oral Oncology, Oral Diseases, Oral Surgery Oral Medicine Oral Pathology Oral Radiology (OOOO), JAMA (Otolaryngology), Frontiers (Oral Health), Supportive Care in Cancer, and Cancer. Dr. Shazib has published chapters in oral oncology and has given talks internationally in various forums. Dr. Shazib is a site visitor for hospital programs for the Commission of Dental Accreditation (CODA), Department of Education.
