

What's New in the Scientific World?

Precision Oncology and Head and Neck Cancer. The feasibility of utilizing a 3D-printed anthropomorphic patient-specific head phantom for patient-specific quality assurance (QA) in intensity-modulated radiotherapy (IMRT) was tested. The authors concluded that, when the 3D-printed patient-specific head phantom was used, the gamma passing rate for $\gamma \leq 1$ was 95.97%, and the gamma failure rate for $\gamma > 1$ was 4.03%. The 3D-printed patient-specific head phantom was considered highly feasible for patient-specific QA prior to procedures such as IMRT*

ASCO Palliative and Supportive Care in Oncology Symposium, San Diego 2017

ASCO held its inaugural Symposium on Palliative and Supportive Care in Oncology in 2014 in Boston, Massachusetts. This symposium was developed in collaboration with AAHPM, ASTRO, and MASCC. The 2017 ASCO Palliative and Supportive Care in Oncology Symposium will be held October 27-28 in San Diego, California.



Educational and networking opportunities will be provided for all healthcare professionals on cancer symptom management across various cancer settings. The main sessions for the San Diego meeting will include integration of innovative models of palliative and supportive care, care challenges in older adults, palliative and supportive care in the era of immunotherapy, opioid management, sexual health, and the role of palliative radiotherapy and surgery. Oral abstracts, posters and a Trainee/Early-Career luncheon are other important features of this upcoming meeting.

At a future meeting, ISOO hopes to present a session on the role of oral supportive care and we will submit a proposal for the 2018 meeting.
