# MASCC/ISOO Mucositis Guidelines Updates

Mucositis is a common toxicity following chemotherapy and radiotherapy for cancer, often necessitating dose reductions and/or treatment breaks. These articles were generated as part of the process of updating the 2014 MASCC/ISOO clinical practice guidelines for the management of mucositis secondary to cancer therapy. Several types of interventions for oral mucositis are presented, including anti-inflammatory agents, photobiomodulation, vitamins, minerals, and nutritional supplements, and protocols

categorized as basic oral care. One paper is dedicated to interventions for the management of gastrointestinal mucositis, i.e., affecting areas in the gastrointestinal tract outside the oral cavity. Each paper has been made free to access where not already Open Access. Developed by the Mucositis Study Group of the Multinational Association of Supportive Care in Cancer/International Society of Oral Oncology (MASCC/ISOO), these articles are part of the MASCC/ISOO clinical practice guidelines for the management of mucositis. This set focuses on the following topics: growth factors and cytokines [Logan et al.], antimicrobials, mucosal coating agents, anesthetics, and analgesics [Saunders et al.], cryotherapy [Correa et al.], and natural and miscellaneous agents [Yarom et al.]. For each of these topics, the literature was reviewed systematically, and new evidence was merged with the evidence published in the previous guideline update [Lalla et al.]. All the data was used to define the upto-date level of evidence (LoE) and a guideline category: Recommendation, Suggestion, or No Guideline Possible.

For all four topics, new evidence was identified, including evidence for interventions for which guidelines were established in the previous update. The new evidence resulted in three scenarios: (1) the LoE and the guideline statement remained unchanged; (2) the LoE was enhanced and the guideline statement remained unchanged; (3) reversal of the guideline statement. In the section presenting Natural and Miscellaneous Agents, evidence for numerous new agents was identified, and 3 new guidelines were established.
